KINGS? NO. COMMUNISM? NO PROBLEM.

Dear Editor,
 The third No-Kings protest rally in Gallup brought nearly 200 protesters to We the People Park on March 28. As I conducted my fourth protest survey over the past year and represented Navcon Patriot's Lyceum Mosh Pit podcast, I noticed a trend in the demographics. Maybe 5% appeared to be Hispanic, 25% Native, and a striking 70% primarily college-educated senior 50+ Whites (McKinley County is 10% White) - 60% of them female - thus reinforcing the trending national stereotype of left-wing affluent White alpha-female liberals dominating anti-Trump protests.

The George Soros-funded Indivisible group which organized the national protests has a membership and

leadership predominantly composed of women as well as grooming women for Democrat political engagement and candidacy. Indivisible also supports robust socialist safety net handouts under their "Economic Justice" initiatives. This is consistent with men twice as likely to have a "very favorable" impression of capitalism as compared to women, who are far

more likely to embrace the warm fuzzy blanket (straitjacket?) of socialist policies.

My main survey questions this time were 1. Which is more authoritarian, king/queen monarchies or communism? 2. How would you feel if this protest was funded by the Chinese Communist Party?

Communism is essentially forced bondage or slavery (socialism is voluntary bondage) while monarchies are mostly constitutional and democratic rather than absolute. I was NOT surprised that twice as many of the 40 or so respondents - all college educated - considered communism to be less authoritarian than monarchies. Almost all were more than happy to participate in my thought-provoking survey, yet some ladies were annoyed I wasn't asking the "right" questions. My goal though is to inspire introspection and self-awareness, and to educate. Despite their college educations, it was clear to me that the horrific realities of communism and socialism are not taught by our leftist academia in America.

As for the authoritarian King Trump, he is the most libertarian (minimal government, maximum freedom) president since Calvin Coolidge.

Securing our liberty from foreign threats with America-first policies, fulfilling campaign promises, and cleaning

up the costly, chaotic, and dangerous open borders mess of the Biden admin (and media) may seem authoritarian to those suffering Trump Derangement Syndrome, yet the vast majority of Americans are relieved that aggressive constitutional action is finally the process.

The cringingly capitulating foreign policies, immigration enforcement, and lame Washington bureaucracy reduction attempts by former presidents were all hat, no cattle, emboldened our enemies and adversaries, enabled cartels, created a deep state, endangered citizens, and all at a very high cost to our economy and taxpayers.

Heinrich: 'I will not fund DHS' immigration efforts without commonsense reform'

WASHINGTON D.C. — U.S. Sen. Martin Heinrich, D-N.M., a member of the U.S. Senate Appropriations Committee, released the following statement on March 27 after Senate Republicans agreed to Senate Democrats' demand to

fund agencies within the U.S. Department of Homeland Security that are not responsible for immigration enforcement — including the Transportation Security Administration, Federal Emergency Management Agency, Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency, and U.S. Coast Guard.

Heinrich and Senate Democrats have made

14 attempts to fund the TSA, FEMA, CISA, and Coast Guard, but Senate Republicans blocked every effort. Heinrich has stated that he will not fund DHS' immigration enforcement efforts without any commonsense reforms to address lawlessness by the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. "From the start,

I've been clear: we must fund TSA, FEMA,

and the Coast Guard," Heinrich said. "Instead, Republicans dragged out a shutdown of those entities for 41 days — forcing TSA agents to go without pay and sending Americans' travel into turmoil — before finally agreeing to fund the parts of DHS not responsible for immigration enforcement. That chaos was entirely avoidable.

"These appropriations are a step in the right direction. And my position remains the same: I will not support funding ICE without real reforms and a restoration to the rule of law. This agency must be held to the same standards as every local law enforcement department in New Mexico and across this country."

The Israel hoax

We've long known that Donald Trump drives his critics crazy, and he's now doing it to some critics who used to be friends. The isolationist right is convinced that President Trump is waging the Iran War in behalf of Israel, which would make him the handmaiden of a foreign power.

That should be a familiar-sounding charge since Democrats and the media spent most of Trump's first term making the same accusation, except the foreign puppeteer was Russia rather than Israel. Now, "Russia, Russia, Russia," as Trump puts it, has become "Israel, Israel, Israel."

All of this is misbegotten, first, because we have never had a president who is so thoroughly his own man as Donald Trump. Good luck trying to control him, as so many advisors have learned over the years. There are few things he's done as president where

you've thought, "Oh, that's so unlike him."

That includes firing FBI director James Comey in his first term, one of the counts against him during the Russia frenzy, and launching the war against Iran today.

Going back 50 years, no one would have been shocked to learn that a nationalistic American president had bombed Iran. Trump is just such a figure, and sure enough, has bombed Iran twice now.

Trump has made bellicose statements about Iran since 1980, and nothing we've heard now suggests anything other than that he genuinely relishes killing Iran's leaders and destroying its weapons.

Temperamentally, Trump loves exercising power, always wants to do it on his own authority and seeks to preserve his options. It shouldn't be surprising, then, that as commander in chief of the world's most proficient military, he's been drawn to using and threatening force.

Israel didn't talk Trump into conducting

his Venezuela raid, or menacing Denmark over Greenland, or looking to Cuba as his next potential target.

One argument, based on a distortion of remarks made by Secretary of State Marco Rubio, is that Israel forced Trump's hand; it was going to attack Iran no matter what, and we knew U.S. personnel would be hit by Iran in response and would be particularly vulnerable if we didn't hit Iran as well.

Check and mate, Bibi Netanyahu.

The idea, though, that Trump was too sheepish to stay Netanyahu's hand if the Israeli prime minister was about to launch a military operation that Trump opposed and was going to jeopardize American lives is preposterous.

Trump has been happy to say "no" to Netanyahu before. He pressured the Israeli leader into turning back planes at the end of the 12 Day War last June.

By alleging that Israel forced the U.S. into war, the isolationists think they are making a harsh

criticism of the Jewish state, but they are really damning Trump. What worse offense can a president of the U.S. commit than subjugating his own nation to a foreign power? It's a treasonous act that deserves impeachment and removal.

This is exactly why the Russian obsessives are so delighted in believing that Trump was a tool of the Kremlin.

Most of the right-wing dissenters blanch at following their own logic. An alternative tack — seen in intelligence

official Joe Kent's resignation letter — is to argue that Trump was fooled. Kent said there was "a misinformation campaign" that created an echo chamber "to deceive" the president.

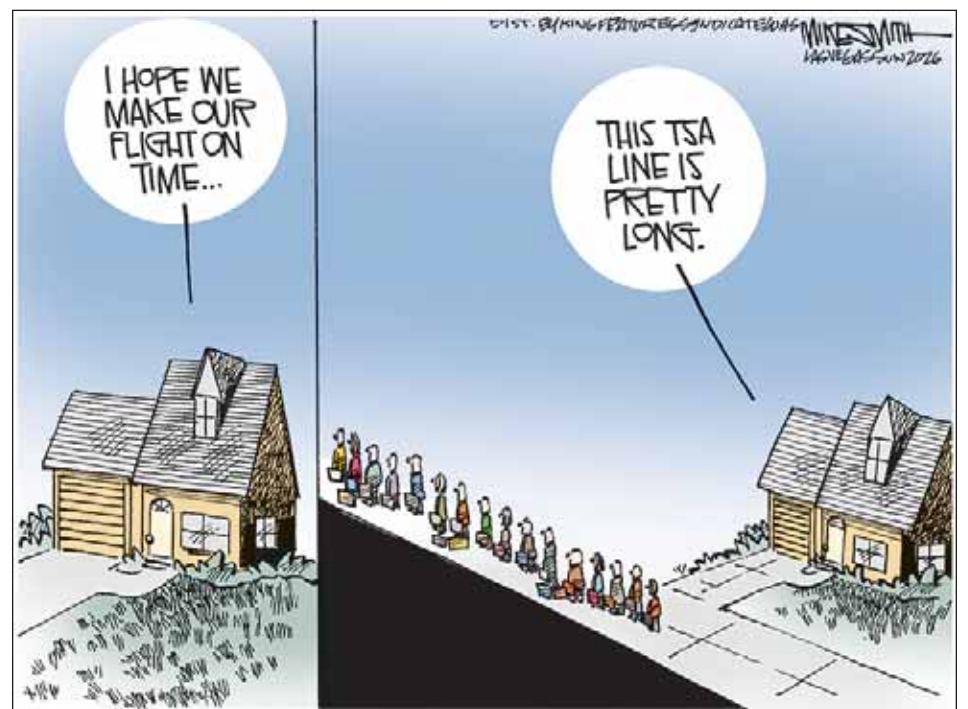
This argument is still a stinging condemnation. It paints Trump as an easily manipulated naif, and on a consequential matter of war and peace. In reality, there was no broad-ranging media drumbeat for war and no wave of popular support. This, again, emphasizes how the decision was

Trump's, and his alone.

The Russian hoax was, in part, driven by the left's shock at Trump's victory in 2016. Likewise, the isolationists are having trouble processing the fact that the president whom they invested so much in launched a major Middle Eastern war. But Trump was not owned by this faction of the right, any more than he is owned by Israel.

WQCC 25-74(R)

The Water Quality Control Commission ("WQCC") will hold a public hearing for this matter beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, June 8, 2026, and continuing for approximately nine (9) business days through Thursday, June 18, 2026, as necessary. The hearing will be conducted in-person at the New Mexico State Capitol Building, 490 Old Santa Fe Trail, Santa Fe, New Mexico, 87501, and virtually via a video conferencing platform. The hearing will last as long as required to hear all testimony, evidence, and public comment. Detailed information concerning the time, location, and the virtual meeting link can be found on the New Mexico Environment Department's ("NMED") event calendar at <https://www.env.nm.gov/events-calendar/>. Please visit the WQCC website prior to the hearing for any updates at <https://www.env.nm.gov/opf/water-quality-control-commission/>, Docketed Matter WQCC 25-74(R). The WQCC may make a decision on the proposed regulatory change at the conclusion of the hearing.

The purpose of the public rulemaking hearing is two-fold: (1) to consider proposed amendments to 20.6.2 NMAC *Ground and Surface Water Protection* regulations to create a State-led surface water permitting program that controls the discharge of pollutants, including dredged and fill material, to "surface waters of the State" under the authority of the New Mexico Water Quality Act, and (2) to consider the proposed new rule 20.6.5 NMAC *New Mexico Pollutant Discharge Elimination System* to enable the State to administer and enforce the federal NPDES Program that controls the discharge of pollutants to "waters of the United States" under the authority of the federal Clean Water Act. These amendments and new rules are responsive to statutory updates to the New Mexico Water Quality Act (NMSA 1978, §§ 74-6-1 through -17) and the creation of the New Mexico Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Act (NMSA 1978, §§ 74-6C-1 through -11) during the 2025 Regular Session of the New Mexico Legislature.

The proposed amendments to 20.6.2 NMAC and proposed new rule 20.6.5 NMAC establish a comprehensive permitting program with statewide application. The proposed amendments to 20.6.2 NMAC add new definitions and add clarification in several existing sections to distinguish between discharges to ground water and to surface waters. The proposed amendments create a 2300 series in 20.6.2 NMAC that applies specifically to surface water permitting and surface water discharges. The proposed amendments detail several topics and timelines, including: when a surface water discharge permit is required, exemptions, individual permits, general permits, general permit coverage, permit conditions, permit processing and issuance, public notice and participation, Secretary review, public

hearings, Water Quality Control Commission review, judicial review, and fees. The proposed new rule at 20.6.5 NMAC covers these same topics and timelines and also includes components specific to EPA requirements for state NPDES programs.
